POSITION SUMMARY

The Geographic Information Systems (GIS) Specialist will serve as a technical resource and aid in the management of The Peregrine Fund's GIS applications and spatial data. They will be responsible for system development, reporting and maintenance to achieve efficient use of GIS applications and data. They will also work to mobilize legacy data. This position works closely with the Database Architect and Quantitative Ecologists to ensure that data are inputted, stored, and outputted for efficient inference. They will also produce maps and data visualizations for The Peregrine Fund's various programs.
